#### Introduction

On 3/06/14, the Crestwood Village Board passed Ordinance # 2149 which established the Office of the Independent Inspector General of the Village of Crestwood and designated the Cook County Sheriff's Office to hold the Office of the Inspector General. (See Attachment #1)

On 07/15/14, the Sheriff's Office received a complaint from a Village of Crestwood trustee regarding the conduct of Village Services Director William Graffeo at a 7/14/14 plan commission meeting. It was reported that during this commission meeting, in which one of the agenda items was the consideration of a special use permit for an adult entertainment business, that Graffeo arrived late at the meeting of which he is a voting member and acted unprofessional by screaming at the other commission members and forcing them to reconsider an earlier motion for tabling a vote on the proposal. It was reported that as a result of Graffeo's actions, commission member Kevin Wasag resigned. The trustee making the complaint stated that the information was derived from commission member Michael Volpentesta. (See Attachment #2)

#### Extent and Results of Investigation

Commission member Michael Volpentesta was interviewed. Volpentesta stated that at the 7/14/14 plan commission meeting, the commission was considering a request for a special use permit for a gentlemen's club at 13601 Kenton. The petitioner was James Marcanio. Several commission members had questions of Marcanio pertaining to parking, security, traffic related issues, police presence, and access related issues, however Marcanio could not provide answers to the commission's questions. Mike Ruth, the commission chairman, attempted to place a motion on the floor for approval. No other commission member responded. Volpentesta stated that he then made a motion to table the request and it was seconded. All five commission members voted yes to the motion.

Volpentesta stated that Marcanio became irate at the commission's action to table his request, and advised them that he would be contacting his attorney and filing litigation. He then left the meeting. A short time later, commission member Bill Graffeo (who also serves as village services director) arrived at the meeting and in an agitated state advised the commission that the Marcanio request had to be voted on at this meeting. Ruth explained that the Marcanio request had been tabled, and Graffeo told him he

could not do that. Graffeo explained that the commission had to pass the request at this time because the village board was going to pass it the next night.

Volpentesta stated that a lengthy and heated discussion ensued. Commission member Kevin Wasag asked what it was that the commission was doing and why they conduct meetings if it means nothing. Wasag then exited the meeting. Graffeo then stated that the commission was a recommending body to the village board. But, Volpentesta said, according to Graffeo, the Marcanio special use permit was a done deal. Graffeo then made a motion to recommend the request to the village board, and commission member Chris Newhall seconded the motion. Volpentesta stated that Graffeo and Newhall voted yes, Ruth and commission member Taczy voted no, and Volpentesta abstained.

Volpentesta stated that he attended the village board meeting the next night. Mayor Presta tabled the Marcanio request at this meeting.

Volpentesta stated he felt Graffeo was unprofessional and appeared to be "strong-arming" the commission on the Marcanio matter. He has heard that Graffeo, in the past, has given no-bid roofing contracts to Marcanio, who owns a roofing business called Avalon Roofing. (See Attachment #3)

Commission member Michael Ruth was interviewed. Ruth stated that at the 7/14/14 commission meeting, the first item on the agenda that night was a request for special use permit to allow a gentlemen's club by petitioner Marcanio. Ruth asked Marcanio to explain the nature of a gentlemen's club. Marcanio explained that it was an adult entertainment business. Ruth asked Marcanio about security at the club. Ruth asked Marcanio about whether security guards at the business would be subject to criminal background checks.

Ruth stated that additional questions were asked by commission members, one of which was pertaining to whether the location of the business was within a 1000 feet of any prohibited land use. Marcanio could not answer many of the questions being posed to him. A motion to approve the request was made but no member seconded the motion. A motion to table the request until additional information could be obtained was then made by Ruth and seconded by Volpentesta. All five members voted to table the Marcanio request.

Ruth stated that Marcanio then threatened to sue because the commission did not approve his request. Ruth recalled that Volpentesta and Marcanio engaged in a "spirited" debate about Marcanio's request and the role of the commission. Marcanio then left the meeting. Ruth stated that the commission then moved on to the next agenda item.

Ruth stated that shortly thereafter, commissioner Graffeo arrived and asked that the Marcanio request be brought back up for discussion and a vote. Graffeo stated that Marcanio's strip club was going to be approved by the full village board so the commission might as well approve it. After some discussion, Graffeo made a motion to approve Marcanio's request. Commissioner Newhall seconded the motion. Ruth stated Graffeo and Newhall voted yes, Ruth and Taczy voted no, and Volpentesta abstained. Commissioner Wasag left the meeting in protest and did not cast a vote. Ruth stated he did not feel Graffeo "strong-armed" the commission, and did not feel Graffeo was unprofessional. Ruth stated he was frustrated with a lack of information from Marcanio especially as it related to security and public safety questions from the members. (See Attachment #4)

Commission member Kevin Wasag was interviewed. Wasag stated that at the plan commission meeting on 7/14/14 was the first time he had heard about a strip club and its owner wanting approval of a special use permit. In the past, the commission used to get the meeting agenda in advance but they stopped that practice. He said that with something as sensitive as a strip club, he would have liked some advance notification that it was going to be discussed. Marcanio was present at the meeting along with a female believed to be his girlfriend. Marcanio had no visual aids or plans of any kind illustrating the project. There were no handouts issued with any information about the proposal.

Wasag stated that as the meeting proceeded, members began asking specific questions to Marcanio about his proposed business. He recalled Ruth asked about security, and Volpentesta and Wasag asked about traffic related issues. Marcanio could not provide answers to any of their questions. The commission then moved to table the request. Marcanio asked if the commission was turning his request down, and Ruth replied it was simply being tabled until more information could be provided. Volpentesta and Marcanio then engaged in some discussion. Wasag recalled that Marcanio advised the members that the proposal was "just business", and that he was a current business owner, and that he liked being a business owner in Crestwood. Marcanio stated that on the basis of the commission not approving the request at that time, he would be forced to initiate litigation against the village board and the commission. Volpentesta then questioned Marcanio as to the inconsistency of Marcanio's earlier statement about liking the village but yet threatening to sue. Marcanio then left the meeting.

Wasag stated that commissioner Graffeo then arrived. Graffeo asked Ruth to re-open the Marcanio discussion. Graffeo immediately advised the commission that Marcanio's request had to be approved at this meeting. Graffeo advised the members that the village board had already indicated it would approve the request. Graffeo said that no commission approval at this meeting tonight meant Marcanio would lose the earnest money he put on the intended property. Graffeo told the commission that

without approval at this meeting, Marcanio would sue and the village could not afford any more lawsuits. Graffeo told the commission that the Village would surely lose this legal battle against Marcanio and it would be very costly.

Wasag stated that Graffeo, in an attempt to appease the commission, stated that the village board was going to require that Marcanio obtain a liquor license which he explained meant that there would be better control over the establishment. There was some additional discussion, and then Graffeo made a motion for a vote to approve the Marcanio request. Newhall seconded the motion. At that point, he stated he was very frustrated and told the commission that since there was a quorum of 5 members, he was leaving the meeting and no longer wished to be a member. He said he told the commission that, given Graffeo's comments, this commission had no real purpose and there was no point in casting a vote. He then left the meeting.

Wasag stated that he could not recall a more emotional topic as that of the strip club special use permit at one of these meetings. Graffeo's behavior was in his opinion a departure from his behavior at other meetings, as he could not recall Graffeo being so adamant about the commission approving a request. (See Attachment #5)

Commission member Dan Taczy was interviewed. Taczy stated that during the 7/14/14 plan commission meeting questions were asked of Marcanio about his strip club proposal by the members, and Marcanio could not answer any of them. He said Marcanio was not prepared with any plans or charts. One of the members asked Marcanio during the meeting if he was going to sue if the commission voted against his request. Marcanio responded that he would indeed sue but that his actions would be "just business, nothing personal."

Taczy stated that the commission voted to table the Marcanio request until the next meeting because they did not have enough specific information about the proposed business. Commissioner Graffeo arrived late to the meeting. Once Graffeo arrived, Graffeo strongly recommended to Ruth that the Marcanio request be brought back up for consideration. Graffeo was fairly forceful in his remarks and request. He stated that Graffeo was adamant that this Marcanio request would obtain approval by the village board. Wasag and Graffeo then engaged in a discussion regarding the intent and purpose of the commission. Wasag became frustrated and told the other members that they had a quorum for a vote and that he was not needed. Wasag then walked out of the meeting.

Taczy stated that Graffeo then made a motion for a vote to approve the Marcanio request and Newhall seconded it. The vote was 2 in favor, 2 against, and 1 abstention. He felt Graffeo's actions were unprofessional since Graffeo kept repeating that the village board was going to approve the request no matter what the commission decided, and that it appeared he was promoting the Marcanio request when he said that the commission had to approve because if they did not then Marcanio would have to pass on the property acquisition. (See Attachment #6)

Several attempts at contacting commission member Chris Newhall by telephone to schedule an interview were made by this Office. The calls were not returned.

A copy of the meeting minutes from the 7/14/14 commission meeting was obtained. (See Attachment #7)

William Graffeo was interviewed. He stated that he has been the Public Service Director since 2007. All village department heads report to him. He also serves as the public works director, the building commissioner, and the health inspector. He is also a voting member of the planning and zoning commission.

Relative to the commission meeting on 7/14/14, Graffeo said nothing unusual occurred at that meeting. He recalled arriving late for the meeting due to the fact that he coaches girls softball and one of his players had been injured in the game that night. After he arrived at the meeting, he engaged member Kevin Wasag in a discussion about the proposed strip club whose owner, James Marcanio, had petitioned the commission for consideration of a special use permit. Wasag told Graffeo that he was against the proposal because he did not want a strip club in town. Graffeo advised Wasag there had to be specific reasons identified by the commission as to why the commission would forward a no vote to the full village board on the proposal.

Graffeo stated that at many of these commission meetings, the members typically look to Graffeo to answer questions pertaining to the requests coming before them because they know Graffeo has a great deal of information gained from his role as village services director.

Graffeo stated that Marcanio had not reached out to him prior to the meeting to ask him to vote in favor of the proposal. He said he did not recall having any conversations privately with Marcanio about whether the commission would vote for or against his proposal.

Graffeo stated that Wasag was the only member that night that was upset. Graffeo said he often arrives late to meetings so that issue was not that unusual. He was unaware prior to arriving at the meeting that the commission voted to postpone a decision on the Marcanio proposal. After some clarification, Graffeo stated that he indeed was the one that asked Ruth for the discussion regarding Marcanio's proposal to be re-opened. He asked that Marcanio's proposal be re-opened because he had information the other commission members did not because he had been present at previous meetings with Marcanio and the Mayor, and at previous initial village board committee meetings when the proposal was first tendered. After some discussion during the meeting, Graffeo explained to the other commission members that the commission needed to forward some type of recommendation to the village board on this proposal because that was their role.

Graffeo stated that the village board does not always follow the recommendations of the commission.

Graffeo stated that he only knows Marcanio from Marcanio being a business owner in town. Marcanio owns two other businesses, those being a bar called At the Office, and a roofing and construction company called Avalon Roofing. He would not characterize Marcanio as a friend and he said he has never socialized with Marcanio. He later clarified his response and said that he has socialized with Marcanio at his bar, but he was with other village officials.

Graffeo said Marcanio has never asked for any special consideration from Graffeo, and Graffeo has never solicited Marcanio for anything. He said Marcanio had once in the past made a financial donation to a softball player Graffeo coached whose family was falling on hard times.

Graffeo confirmed that Avalon Roofing has received contracts for roofing work from the village. He said all of those contracts were competitively bid. He corrected himself and said one of the jobs was a no bid contract due to the fact it was deemed an emergency. He said per village code, all contracts exceeding \$20,000 must be put out for bid. He said much of the work given to Avalon was less than \$20,000, but he went out to bid nonetheless. Other bidders that competed with Avalon were Durable Roofing and Stan's Roofing. He said Stan's Roofing has in the past won a bid for village work.

Graffeo stated that At the Office and Avalon Roofing were the only Marcanio-owned businesses he was aware of. He said the village has purchased plumbing supplies from a company named Southwest Metal Distributors of Florida. He said it is not uncommon to utilize out of state vendors. He became aware of Southwest when Marcanio told him about the company while he and Marcanio were at a job site where Marcanio was using the village's fire hydrant. He was unaware that Marcanio owned Southwest. He said

he would have no way of knowing whether the material appearing on various invoices was actually received by the public works department from Southwest. He then said after asking the question again that his public works crew does keep an inventory of parts.

Graffeo stated that he did not see any reason to recuse himself from the Marcanio proposal before the commission. He said he made the motion that night before the commission to approve Marcanio's proposal and voted yes. He said he voted in favor of it because he knew if he did not that Marcanio would sue. When asked during this interview about how he would have known of Marcanio's intention of bringing forth litigation, he said he learned of that during the initial meeting held with the village board committee.

Graffeo stated that at no time on the night of 7/14/14 did he speak with Marcanio. Marcanio had already left the meeting prior to Graffeo's arrival. Graffeo then stated that he "does not believe" that he spoke with Marcanio that night.

Graffeo reiterated that his actions were professional during the commission meeting that night and he did not raise his voice or become confrontational with any of the board members. (See Attachment #8)

James Marcanio was interviewed. Marcanio stated that when he showed up for the plan commission meeting on 7/14/14, he thought the purpose was to have the opportunity to present the commission with his business plan. He said he was not prepared to answer the commission's specific questions about certain aspects of the proposal.

Marcanio stated that the commission postponed the vote on his proposal. He then left the meeting. Graffeo was not present at the meeting when Marcanio left. As soon as he got the opportunity he called Graffeo to advise him the commission postponed the vote to approve or deny his proposal. He said he told Graffeo that the meeting was "weird" and that he felt like it was more of an interrogation.

Marcanio stated that he has known Graffeo for over 3 years and that he knows him well enough to be able to text him messages on his cellphone if Marcanio needs something from the village. He said he recently sent Graffeo a text after he was contacted by the Illinois Gaming Board with an inquiry about the video poker machines at the bar and wording in his current lease agreement.

Marcanio stated that he owns Avalon Roofing and that he has received work from the village over the years. He said he used to own Southwest Metal Distributors in Florida which he knows has supplied plumbing supplies to the village. He said the business did not grow like he had hoped and he closed it in

2013. He said he originally opened this business in Florida because he intended for it to be a multi-state type business and because he owned a second home there that he visited frequently. Graffeo was aware that he owned Southwest and that the village was purchasing supplies from him.

Marcanio stated that Graffeo's daughter is employed at At the Office as a waitress. Graffeo and several other village employees as well as village elected officials have frequented Marcanio's bar over the years.

Marcanio stated that just after the commission postponed any action and while the proposal was being covered in the newspapers, he received a call from Trustee John Toscas. Toscas encouraged Marcanio to keep moving forward with his strip club proposal. Marcanio stated that Toscas told him "keep going, you have them on the ropes. They cannot keep you out." Marcanio said that at the end of the telephone call Toscas asked him if he would be willing to make a donation to the Crestwood Soccer Club, a non-for profit group that Toscas operates. Marcanio stated he wrote a \$1000 check to the Soccer Club the next day. (See Attachment #9)

Investigators met with village fiscal staff to determine if there was a way to determine by record if plumbing supplies paid for by the village were actually received. No records outside of the public works department (which Graffeo supervises) exist for that type of transaction. During a recent meeting with Village Trustee Flynn, she related that she and other trustees were unaware that Marcanio owned a company that supplied materials to the village. She expressed her concern over that.

A copy from the Village Ordinance Code book pertaining to the position of village services director is included in this report. It states, under the section illustrating powers and duties, that the position is responsible, among other things, for the coordination of village departments, boards and commissions, toward the goal of achieving efficient operation of the village government. Although the ordinance states that the position's duties include those listed but are not limited to those listed, this Office could not find a specific enumeration giving the position a voting seat as a member of the planning and zoning commission. (See Attachment #10)

A copy from the Village Ordinance Code book pertaining to village contracts is included in this report. It states that all contracts for supplies or capital improvements where the amount exceeds \$10,000 shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder, after advertising for the same, unless the Village Board specifically waives the provision prior to purchasing. (See Attachment #11)

Copies of the invoices and village checks to Avalon Roofing/Avalon Construction between 2011 and 2013 were obtained. These records indicate that Marcanio received 15 contracts for work totaling \$109,400. Of those 15, four were over \$10,000. (See Attachment #12)

Copies of the invoices and village checks to Southwest Metal Distributors were obtained. These records indicate that the village purchased supplies from Marcanio's company on four occasions between 2012 and 2013 totaling \$13,751. (See Attachment #13)

A copy of the Village of Crestwood Ordinance #2167, known as "An Ordinance Amending Title III of the Crestwood Village Code by Creating a New Chapter 38 Entitled Conflict of Interest and Improper Influence", was obtained. (See Attachment #14)

The Illinois Board of Elections website was checked for any campaign contributions made by Marcanio or any of his companies to elected officials in Crestwood. Records indicate that on 6/18/14, At The Office Inc. made a \$500 individual contribution to Citizens for Presta. (See Attachment #15)

A check of the Illinois Secretary of State's website indicates that At The Office Inc. was involuntarily dissolved on 04/11/14. (See Attachment #16)

#### Conclusion and Recommendations

Based upon interviews conducted and statements collected, as well as a review of other documentation, this investigation found somewhat conflicting information as to Graffeo's actions on 7/14/14 and whether they were unprofessional after interviewing the individual commission members present that evening.

This Office could not make a determination from the interviews of those present as to whether Graffeo acted unprofessionally by yelling or screaming or "strong-arming" the rest of the commission into re-opening discussions pertaining to the Marcanio petition.

However, by his own admission, Graffeo did request that Ruth and the commission open discussion and re-vote on Marcanio's petition. Graffeo's influence, described in the original complaint as "strong-arming", may have, it appears, been more subtle. Of concern to this Office is the perception of improper influence by Graffeo on the commission. Wasag had stated that he had never recalled Graffeo being so adamant about the commission approving a petition. Wasag and Taczy both recalled that Graffeo made

reference to Marcanio losing the property deal if the proposal was not approved. Volpentesta made reference to Marcanio owning Avalon Roofing and that Avalon had done business with the village.

Additionally, this concern is supported by other information obtained during the investigation relative to Marcanio's relationship with Graffeo and the work given to Marcanio for the roofing/construction projects and procurement of plumbing supplies.

This Office found it significant that Graffeo during his interview could not recall whether he spoke to Marcanio by telephone the night of the meeting (even though Marcanio stated in his interview that he called Graffeo as soon as he could once he left the meeting), that Graffeo failed to advise investigators that his daughter worked for Marcanio, and that Graffeo advised investigators that village contracts over \$20,000 needed to be publically bid when the figure per village code is actually \$10,000.

This Office also found it significant that Graffeo advised in his interview that he was unaware that Southwest Metal Distributors was in fact owned by Marcanio (even though Marcanio stated in his interview that Graffeo was aware of his ownership). It certainly appeared to be a concern of Trustee Flynn when she was advised by this Office as to who owned this company.

Based on the totality of the documentation gather during the investigation, it is reasonable to conclude that Graffeo intentionally, for reasons unknown, gave Marcanio favorable treatment at the commission hearing by re-opening discussions after a vote to table the Marcanio petition had occurred.

Further, as noted in Ordinance #2167, the section under Contract Inducements states, "no village official or employee shall exercise contract management authority where any relative or domestic partner of the official or employee is employed by or has contracts with persons doing Village work over which the Village official or employee has or exercise contract management authority." By his own admission, Graffeo stated he awarded the contracts for the roofing and construction work Marcanio performed for the village over a three year period. Marcanio admitted to employing Graffeo's daughter at his bar.

Also of concern to this Office is the appointment of Graffeo to the commission as a voting member while serving as the public services director. It appeared that Graffeo exerted control during the 7/14/14 meeting and overruled Chairman Ruth based on his dual role as commissioner and village supervisor. This fact was brought out in Volpentesta's statement about Ruth advising that a vote to table the Marcanio petition had been passed, and Graffeo advising Ruth that he could not do that.

It is this Office's understanding in reviewing information pertaining to village government in Illinois that most municipal organizations establish boards and commissions to be independent entities with either regulatory or advisory responsibilities to the elected officials. Having a village staff employee who has as much authority as Graffeo does, serve as a voting member on a commission, in this Office's opinion, erodes the independence of that commission and can, again, lead to the perception of an inherent conflict of interest.

Graffeo remarked that the commission members often ask him questions about the proposed developments the commission is considering before it, and that his role as a village services director allows him to have more information than the commission members. Similar to his role as an advisor to the full village board, this Office feels that the same should apply to the plan commission.

It is recommended that, on the basis of this investigation, that the Mayor and Village Board amend Graffeo's job description and remove him as a voting member of the plan commission.

It is also recommended that the village conduct an audit or inquiry as to whether bids were received for the three non-emergency contracts awarded to Marcanio exceeding \$10,000, and whether the public works department actually received the plumbing supplies purchased from Southwest Metal Distributors.

The Sheriff's Office considers this investigation closed.

ORDINANCE NO. 2149 (2014)  
VILLAGE OF CRESTWOOD

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF  
"INDEPENDENT INSPECTOR GENERAL OF THE VILLAGE OF CRESTWOOD"  
AND DESIGNATING THE COOK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE  
TO HOLD THE OFFICE OF INSPECTOR GENERAL

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WHEREAS, the Village of Crestwood is facing unprecedented financial and community challenges; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the residents of the Village trust and have confidence in the integrity of their elected and appointed officials, as well as the employees of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood have determined that in order to promote honest and effective government, it is appropriate that the Village establish an independent office to whom the people of this Village can turn for assistance in eliminating both the fact of and the appearance of fraud, corruption, and unethical activities in Village government; and

WHEREAS, the Cook County Sheriff's Office has offered to serve the Village, without charge, in the capacity of an Independent Inspector General for the Village of Crestwood; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees have further determined that establishing an Office of Independent Inspector General and authorizing the Cook County Sheriff's Office to hold that office will assist the corporate authorities in promoting honesty, transparency, ethical responsibility and fiscal responsibility in the Village government;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CRESTWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, in the exercise of the Village's authority as follows:

**SECTION 1: Office of Independent Inspector General Created.** There is hereby created the office of "Independent Inspector General" ("OIG") for the Village of Crestwood.

**SECTION 2: Designation of Cook County Sheriff.** The Office of the Cook County Sheriff is hereby designated as the OIG. The OIG shall serve for an initial term of two (2) years and may be reappointed thereafter for successive two (2) year terms. The OIG shall serve without compensation.

**SECTION 3: Purpose of Office.** The purpose of the OIG is to detect, deter and prevent corruption, fraud, waste, mismanagement, unlawful political discrimination, unlawful activity and/or misconduct in the operation of Village government (collectively referred to elsewhere in Ordinance as "Misconduct"). "Unlawful political discrimination" shall include, but not be limited to basing the terms and conditions of a non-exempt employee's employment such as hiring, firing, promotion, transfer, discipline or termination on political reasons and factors.

**SECTION 4: Powers and Duties of OIG.** The OIG shall have the following powers and duties:

A. To receive and register complaints concerning Misconduct in the operation of Village government, including but not limited to:

- (i) Misconduct in connection with the Village's award of any contract, license, or benefit;
- (ii) Misconduct of any Village employee;

- (iii) Misconduct of any elected or appointed official of the Village in the performance of his or her official duties;
- (iv) Misconduct of contractors, vendors, and professional service providers who furnish goods and services to the Village;
- (v) Misconduct of persons and businesses seeking to do business with the Village; and
- (vi) Retaliation against any Village employee or elected or appointed official of the Village based upon their cooperation with the OIG.

B. To investigate Misconduct in the operation of Village government, either in response to such complaints or on the OIG's own initiative.

C. To refer complaints and information regarding possible Misconduct to other outside law enforcement agencies, including, but not limited to the United States Attorney.

D. To obtain information from and conduct interviews under oath with Village elected or appointed officials, employees, agents, contractors and persons doing or seeking to do business with the Village of the purpose of investigating potential Misconduct.

E. To make recommendations for corrective action to the Mayor and Board of Trustees with respect to combating Misconduct.

F. To provide periodic reports to the President and Board of Trustees as to the status of matters within the scope of OIG's authority, to the extent such reporting would not impair the integrity of ongoing investigations.

G. To maintain an OIG hotline number and email address in order to facilitate citizen and employee reports of Misconduct.

**SECTION 5. Duty to Cooperate.**

A. It shall be the duty of all Village employees, elected and appointed officials, agents, independent contractors to the Village, vendors, licensees, and those doing or seeking to do business with the Village, to cooperate with the OIG in the conduct of any investigation undertaken pursuant to the OIG's authority.

B. Subject to constitutional protections, failure of any Village employee or appointed official to cooperate with the OIG shall be considered cause for disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment or removal from office.

C. It shall be the duty of any party doing business with the Village to likewise cooperate with the OIG. Refusal to cooperate shall be considered cause for termination of a contract, license or similar benefit, or as grounds for the Village refusal to enter into a future contract, license or other benefit.

**SECTION 6: Acknowledgement of Duty to Cooperate.** All contracts for goods and services, and all future licenses or other benefits issued by the Village after the effective date of this Ordinance, shall be subject to the requirement that the individual or entity receiving the contract, license, or benefit, agree to fully comply with requirements of this Ordinance relating to cooperation with the Inspector General's Office.

**SECTION 7. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval as required by law.

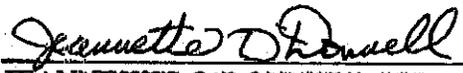

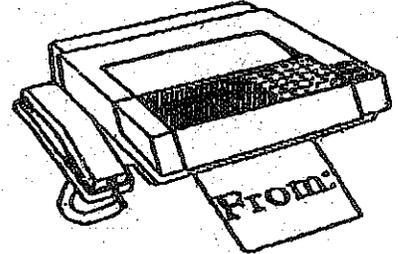
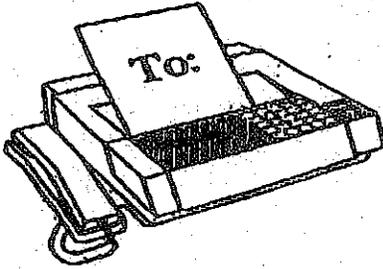

I interviewed Crestwood Planning Commission board member Michael Volpentesta on 7/23/14 regarding an incident that occurred during the recent Plan Commission meeting on 7/14/14.

Volpentesta stated the following reported in summary:

The Commission was considering a request for a special use permit for a gentleman's club at 13601 Kenton. The petitioner was Jaime Marcanio. Several board members had questions of Marcanio pertaining to parking, security, traffic related issues, police presence, and access related issues, however Marcanio could not provide answers to the commission's questions.

Mike Ruth, the commission chairman, attempted to place a motion on the floor for approval. No other commission members responded. Volpentesta stated he then made a motion to table the request and it was seconded. All five commission members voted yes to the motion.

Marcanio became irate at the commission's action to table his request, and advised them that he would be contacting his attorney and filing litigation. He then left the meeting.

A short time later, commission member Bill Graffeo (who also serves as village services director) arrived at the meeting and in an agitated state advised the board that the Marcanio request had to be voted on at this meeting. Chairman Ruth explained that the Marcanio request had been tabled, and Graffeo told him he could not do that. Graffeo explained that the commission had to pass the request at this time because the village board was going to pass it the next night.

A lengthy and heated discussion ensued. Kevin Wasag asked what it was that the commission was doing and why they conduct meetings if it means nothing. He then exited the meeting.

Graffeo then stated that this commission is a recommending body to the village board. But, he said, the Marcanio special use permit is a done deal. Graffeo then made a motion to recommend the request to the board, and Chris Newhall seconded the motion. Volpentesta stated Graffeo and Newhall voted yes, Ruth and Taczy voted no, and Volpentesta abstained.

He is not sure if the motion passed under those circumstances.

He said he attended the village board meeting the next night. Mayor Presta tabled the Marcanio request at this meeting.

He believes that the Board has informed Marcanio recently that his location is too close to a church and his application for a special use permit would therefore be denied. Upon hearing that, Marcanio responded that he will simply look for another location for the strip-club.

He felt Graffeo was unprofessional and appeared to be "strong-arming" the commission on the Marcanio matter.

He has heard that Graffeo in the past has given no-bid roofing contracts to Marcanio.

I interviewed Crestwood Planning Commission Chairman Michael Ruth on 8/26/14 regarding an incident that occurred during the recent Plan Commission meeting on 7/14/14.

Ruth stated the following reported in summary:

The first item on the agenda that night was a request for special use permit to allow a gentlemen's club by petitioner Jaime Marcanio. Ruth asked Marcanio to explain the nature of a gentlemen's club. Marcanio explained it was an adult entertainment business. Ruth asked Marcanio about security at the club. Ruth asked Marcanio about whether security guards at the business would be subject to criminal background checks.

He said additional questions were asked by commission members, one of which was pertaining to whether the location of the business was within a 1000 feet of any prohibited land use. Marcanio could not answer many of the questions being posed to him.

I interviewed Crestwood Planning Commission member Kevin Wasag on 09/09/14 regarding an incident that occurred during the recent Plan Commission meeting on 7/14/14.

Wasag stated the following reported in summary:

The meeting that evening was the first time he had heard about a strip club and its owner wanting approval of a special use permit. In the past, the commission used to get the meeting agenda in advance but they stopped that practice. He said that with something as sensitive as a strip club, he would have liked some advance notification that it was going to be discussed.

Jamie Marcanio, the petitioner, was present with a female believed to be his girlfriend. Marcanio had no visual aids or plans of any kind illustrating the project. There were no handouts issued with any information about the proposal.

As the meeting proceeded, members began asking specific questions to Marcanio about his proposed business. He recalled Chairman Ruth asked about security, and both Commissioner Volpentesta as well as he asked about traffic related issues. Marcanio could not provide answers to any of their questions.

The commission then moved to table the request. Marcanio asked if the commission was turning his request down, and Ruth replied it was simply being tabled until more information could be provided. Volpentesta and Marcanio then engaged in some discussion. Wasag recalled that Marcanio advised the members that the proposal was "just business", and that he was a current business owner (At the Office tavern), and that he liked being a business owner in Crestwood. Marcanio stated that on the basis of the commission not approving the request at that time, he would be forced to initiate litigation against the village board and the commission. Volpentesta then questioned Marcanio as to the inconsistency of

Marcanio's earlier statement about liking the village but yet threatening to sue. Marcanio then left the meeting.

Commissioner Bill Graffeo arrived. Graffeo asked Ruth to re-open the Marcanio discussion. Graffeo immediately advised the commission that Marcanio's request had to be approved at this meeting. Graffeo advised the members that the village board had already indicated it would approve the request. Graffeo said that no commission approval at this meeting tonight meant Marcanio would lose the earnest money he put on the intended property. Graffeo told the commission that without approval at this meeting, Marcanio would sue and the village could not afford any more lawsuits. Graffeo told the commission that the Village would surely lose this legal battle against Marcanio and it would be very costly.

Graffeo, in an attempt to appease the commission, stated that the village board was going to require that Marcanio obtain a liquor license which he explained meant that there would be better control over the establishment.

There was some additional discussion, and then Graffeo made a motion for a vote to approve the Marcanio request. Newhall seconded the motion. At that point, Wasag stated he was very frustrated and told the commission that since there was a quorum of 5 members with Graffeo now present, he was leaving the meeting and no longer wished to be a member. He said he told the commission that, given Graffeo's comments, this commission had no real purpose and there was no point in casting a vote. He then left the meeting.

He could not recall a more emotional topic as the strip club at one of these meetings.

Graffeo's behavior was in his opinion a departure from his behavior at other meetings, as he could not recall Graffeo being so adamant about approving a request.

Africa Gansallo, Michael Suspenzi, and I interviewed Crestwood Public Services Director William Graffeo at his office about a complaint against him involving an incident that occurred during the recent planning and zoning commission meeting on 7/14/14.

Graffeo stated the following reported in summary:

He has been the Public Service Director since 2007. All village department heads report to him. He also serves as the public works director, the building commissioner, and the health inspector. He is a voting member of the planning and zoning commission.

Relative to the planning and zoning commission meeting on 7/14/14, he said nothing unusual occurred at that meeting. He recalled arriving late for the meeting due to the fact that he coaches girls softball and one of his players had been injured in the game that night. After he arrived at the meeting, he engaged member Kevin Wasag in discussions about the proposed strip club whose owner, James Marcanio, had petitioned the commission for consideration of a special use permit. Wasag told Graffeo that he was against the proposal because he did not want a strip club in town. Graffeo advised Wasag that specific reasons had to be identified by the commission as to why the commission would forward a no vote to the full village board on the proposal.

At many of these commission meetings, the members typically look to Graffeo to answer questions pertaining to the requests coming before them because they know Graffeo has a great deal of information gained from his role as village services director.

Graffeo stated that Marcanio had not reached out to him prior to the meeting to ask him to vote in favor of the proposal. He said he did not recall having any conversations privately with Marcanio about whether the commission would vote for or against his proposal.

Graffeo stated that Wasag was the only member that night that was upset. Graffeo said he often arrives late at meetings so that issue was not that unusual. He was unaware prior to arriving at the meeting that the commission voted to postpone a decision on the Marcanio proposal. After some clarification, Graffeo stated that he indeed was the one that asked Chairman Mike Ruth that the discussion regarding Marcanio's proposal be re-opened. He asked that Marcanio's proposal be re-opened because he had information the other commission members did not because he had been present at previous meetings with Marcanio and the Mayor, and at previous initial village board committee meetings when the proposal was first tendered. After some discussion during the meeting, Graffeo explained to the other commission members that the commission needed to forward some type of recommendation to the village board on this proposal because that was the role of the planning and zoning commission.

Graffeo stated that the village board does not always follow the recommendations of the commission.

Graffeo stated that he only knows Marcanio from Marcanio being a business owner in town. Marcanio owns two other businesses, those being a bar called At the Office, and a roofing and construction company called Avalon Roofing. He would not characterize Marcanio as a friend and he said he has never socialized with Marcanio. Graffeo said Marcanio has never asked for any special consideration from Graffeo, and Graffeo has never solicited Marcanio for anything. He said Marcanio had once in the past made a financial donation to a softball player Graffeo coached whose family was falling on hard times.

Graffeo confirmed that Avalon Roofing has received contracts for roofing work from the village. He said all of those contracts were competitively bid. He corrected himself and said one of the jobs was not bid due to the fact it was deemed an emergency. He said per village code, all contracts exceeding \$20,000 must be put out for bid. He said much of the work given to Avalon was less than \$20,000, but he went out to bid nonetheless. Other bidders that competed with Avalon were Durable Roofing and Stan's Roofing. He said Stan's Roofing has in the past won a bid for village work.

Graffeo stated that At the Office and Avalon Roofing were the only Marcanio-owned businesses he was aware of. He said the village has purchased plumbing supplies from a company named Southwest Metal Distributors of Florida. He said it is not uncommon to utilize out of state vendors. He became aware of Southwest when Marcanio told him about the company while he and Marcanio were at a job site where Marcanio was using the village's fire hydrant. He was unaware that Marcanio owned Southwest. He said he would have no way of knowing whether the material appearing on invoices was actually received by the public works department from Southwest. He then said after asking the question again that his public works crew does keep an inventory of parts.

Graffeo stated that he did not see any reason to recuse himself from the Marcanio proposal before the commission. He said he made the motion that night before the commission to approve Marcanio's

proposal and voted yes. He said he voted in favor of it because he knew if he did not that Marcanio would sue. When asked during this interview about how he would have known of Marcanio's intention of bringing forth litigation, he said he learned of that during the initial meeting held with the village board committee.

Graffeo stated that at no time on the night of 7/14/14 did he speak with Marcanio. Marcanio had already left the meeting prior to Graffeo's arrival. Graffeo then stated he "does not believe" that he spoke with Marcanio that night.

Graffeo reiterated that his actions were professional during the commission meeting that night and he did not raise his voice or become confrontational with any of the board members.

Africa Gansallo, Michael Suspenzi, and I interviewed James Marcanio at his Crestwood tavern called At the Office regarding a recent Village of Crestwood planning and zoning commission meeting wherein he was petitioning for a special use permit to open and operate a adult entertainment business.

Marcanio stated the following reported in summary:

When he showed up for the meeting he thought the purpose was to have the opportunity to present the commission with his business plan. He said he was not prepared to answer the commission's specific questions about certain aspects of the proposal.

Marcanio stated that the commission postponed the vote on his proposal. He then left the meeting. Graffeo was not present at the meeting when Marcanio left. As soon as he got the opportunity he called Graffeo to advise him the commission postponed the vote to approve or deny his proposal. He said he told Graffeo that the meeting was "weird" and that he felt like it was more of an interrogation.

Marcanio stated that he has known Graffeo for over 3 years and that he knows him well enough to be able to text him messages on his cellphone if Marcanio needs something from the village. He said he recently sent Graffeo a text after being contacted by the Illinois Gaming Board with an inquiry about the video poker machines at the bar and wording in his current lease agreement.

Marcanio stated he owns Avalon Roofing and that he has received work from the village over the years. He said he used to own Southwest Metal Distributors in Florida which he knows has supplied plumbing supplies to the village. He said the business did not grow liked he had hoped and he closed it in 2013. He said he originally opened this business in Florida because he intended it to be a multi-state type business and because he owned a second home there that he visited frequently. Graffeo was aware he owned Southwest and that the village was purchasing supplies from him.

Marcanio stated that Graffeo's daughter is employed at At the Office as a waitress. Graffeo and several other village employees as well as village elected officials have frequented Marcanio's bar over the years.

Marcanio stated that just after the commission postponed any action and while the proposal was being covered in the newspapers, he received a call from Trustee John Toscas. Toscas encouraged Marcanio to keep moving forward with his strip club proposal. Marcanio stated that Toscas told him "keep going, you have them on the ropes. They cannot keep you out." Marcanio said that at the end of the telephone call Toscas asked him if he would be willing to make a donation to the Crestwood Soccer Club, a non-for profit group that Toscas operates. Marcanio stated he wrote a \$1000 check to the Soccer Club the next day.

§ 32.100 OFFICE ESTABLISHED; APPOINTMENT; TERM.

§ 32.102 POWERS AND DUTIES; LIMITATIONS.

  - (1) Direction, coordination and supervision of village services to residents and businesses;
  - (2) Direction, coordination and supervision of:
    - (a) Public works, water, sanitation, streets and municipal improvements;
    - (b) Village properties; and
    - (c) Public ways.
  - (3) Coordination of village departments, boards and commissions toward the goal of achieving efficient operation of the village government;
  - (4) Liaison assistance between village departments, boards, commission, employees and officials for the purpose of providing coordinated services to the public and citizenry of the village;
  - (5) Responses to public requests and inquiries concerning village operations and services;

(6) Coordination and supervision of compliance notices and complaints pertaining to alleged violations of village health, building and zoning codes and ordinances to assure vigorous prosecution thereof and the presentation of relevant testimony and documentation;

(7) General supervision of village employees with implementation and recommendation of village personnel policies and practices;

(8) Assistance in providing information to residents and business persons in the village, in cooperation with the Community Relations Department and other departments, as to village activities and programs;

(9) Attendance, as official representative of the village and Village Board, at meetings concerning all municipal functions with other governmental bodies and agencies, civic, neighborhood, business, religious, charitable, homeowners', apartment dwellers' and condominium members' organizations and associations; and

(10) Attendance at regular, special and committee meetings of the Mayor and Board of Trustees for the purpose of receiving directions therefrom and public participation thereat.

(B) *Reports required.* Not less than once each fiscal year and at any other times as requested by the Mayor or Board of Trustees, the Village Services Director shall provide a written report of his or her services, activities, programs and duties, together with recommendations, and the proposals received from others, as to additional and further Village Services Director activities, plans, duties, responsibilities and studies.

(C) *Limitations on powers.* The Village Services Director shall have no power to incur liability or, in any way, transact business for or in the name of the village.

(Prior Code, § 1-7E-3) (Ord. 852, passed 5-21-1981)

§ 32.103 COMPENSATION.

The Village Services Director shall receive the compensation as prescribed and approved at the time of appointment and/or as recited, from time to time, in the annual appropriation ordinance of the village.

(Prior Code, § 1-7E-4) (Ord. 852, passed 5-21-1981)

37.04 CONTRACTS.

(A) All contracts for supplies or capital improvements by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees where the amount of the contract exceeds \$10,000 shall be furnished by contract and let to the lowest responsible bidder, after advertising for the same, unless the Village Board specifically waives this provision prior to purchasing supplies or contracting for capital improvements.

(B) Advertising shall be made and bids submitted and received by the Village Clerk.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2167**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III OF THE CRESTWOOD VILLAGE CODE BY  
CREATING A NEW CHAPTER 38 ENTITLED  
CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND IMPROPER INFLUENCE**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood, Illinois believe the citizens of the Village need to be assured that the public officials and employees exhibit the highest standards of ethical conduct.

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood recognize that the proper operation of a democratic government requires that public officials of the Village be independent, impartial, transparent in their conduct of public business and responsible to the Village and its residents in order to the serve and protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Board of Trustees desire to amend the Village Code to include a Code of Ethics to provide and prohibit conflicts of interest in the Village government; and

**WHEREAS**, The Mayor and Board of Trustees have determined that it is in the best interest of the Village and its residents to amend Title III, adding Chapter 38 of the Crestwood Village Code entitled "Conflicts of Interest and Improper Influence".

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Village of Crestwood, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

**SECTION 2:** That Title III: Administration, Chapter 38 of the Crestwood Village Code is hereby amended by adding the following Chapter entitled, "Conflicts of Interest and Improper Influence," and said Chapter shall read as follows:

**CHAPTER 38: CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND IMPROPER INFLUENCE**

**§ 38.01 DEFINITIONS.** The following definitions shall apply for purposes of this Chapter:

**ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION.** Any decision on, or any proposal, consideration, enactment or making of any rule, regulation, or any other official non-ministerial action or non-action by any Village department, Village commission, or by any official or employee of any Village department, or any matter which is within the official jurisdiction of the Village Services Director's Office.

**AGENCY.** The corporate authorities of the Village of Crestwood, any committee or other subdivision thereof; any Village department or other administrative unit, commission, board, or other division of the government of the Village.

**COMPENSATION.** Money, thing of value or other pecuniary benefit received or to be received in return for, or as reimbursement for, services rendered or to be rendered.

**CONTRACT MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY.** Personal involvement in, or direct supervisory responsibility for, the formulation or execution of a Village contract, including without limitation the preparation of specifications, evaluation of bids or proposals, negotiation of contract terms or supervision of performance.

**COVERED RELATIVE.** The spouse or domestic partner of any official, candidate for Village office, or employee, or the immediate family, and relatives residing in the same residence with the official, candidate for Village office, or employee.

**DOING BUSINESS.** Any one or any combination of sales, purchases, leases or contracts to, from, or with the Village or any Village Department in an amount in excess of \$10,000.00 in any 12 consecutive months.

**EMPLOYEE.** An individual employed by the Village, whether part-time or full-time, but excludes elected officials, the Village Services Director, Department Heads, and Village contractors.

**EXPENDITURE.** A payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or anything of value.

**FINANCIAL INTEREST.** An interest held by an official or employee that is valued or capable of valuation in monetary terms with a current value of more than \$1,000.00, provided that such interest shall not include (1) the authorized compensation paid to an official or employee for any office or employment; or (2) a time or demand deposit in a financial institution; or (3) an endowment or insurance policy or annuity contract purchased from an insurance company; or (4) any ownership, through purchase at fair market value or inheritance of the shares of a mutual fund corporation, regardless of the value of or dividends on such shares, if such shares are registered on a securities exchange pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended; or (5) any ownership, through purchase at fair market value or inheritance, of not more than \$15,000.00 worth of the shares of a corporation, or any corporate subsidiary, parent or affiliate thereof, regardless of the dividends on such shares, if such shares are registered on a securities exchange pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended. Such interest also shall not include any ownership by a current official or employee through purchase at fair market value or inheritance of less than one percent of the shares of a corporation, or any corporate subsidiary, parent or affiliate thereof, regardless of the value or dividends on such shares, if such shares are registered on a securities exchange pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, and if such ownership existed before November 1, 2012; or (6) a referral or finder's fee payment or promised understanding or agreement to receive such fee or payment.

**GIFT.** Anything of value given without fair-market consideration.

**LEGISLATION.** Any ordinance, resolution, amendment, nomination, report or any other matter pending or proposed before the Board of Trustees or a committee thereof, or any appointed Village Board, including any other matter which may be the subject of Board action.

**LEGISLATIVE ACTION.** The introduction, sponsorship, consideration, debate, amendment, passage, defeat, approval, veto or other official action or non-action on any ordinance, resolution, motion, order, appointment, application or other matter pending or proposed before the Village Board or any committee or subcommittee thereof.

**PERSON.** Any individual, entity, corporation, partnership, firm, association, union, trust, estate, as well as any parent or subsidiary of any of the foregoing, whether or not operated for profit.

**PROFESSIONAL SERVICES.** Services in any occupation requiring advanced or specialized education and training, including without limitation, law, accounting, insurance, real estate, engineering, medicine, architecture, dentistry, banking, finance, public relations, education or consulting.

**RELATIVE.** A person who is related to an official, candidate for Village office, or employee as spouse or as any of the following, whether by blood or by adoption: parent, child, brother or sister, aunt or uncle, niece or nephew, grandparent, grandchild, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, stepfather or stepmother, stepson or stepdaughter, stepbrother or stepsister, half-brother or half-sister.

**SEEKING TO DO BUSINESS.** (1) Taking any action within the past six months to obtain a contract or business from the Village when, if such action were successful, it would result in the person's doing business with the Village; and (2) The contract or business sought has not been awarded to any person.

**VILLAGE.** The Village of Crestwood, Illinois.

**VILLAGE CONTRACTOR.** Any person (including his or her agents or employees acting within the scope of their employment) who is paid from the general fund of the Village or any other special fund of the Village or pursuant to Village ordinance, for services to the Village regardless of the nature of the relationship of such individual to the Village for purposes other than this Chapter 38. "Village contractor" shall not include officials and employees.

**VILLAGE OFFICIAL.** Any elected official in the Village of Crestwood, the Village Services Director, any person appointed to a Village Commission, Committee or Board, and all Department Heads.

**VILLAGE PROPERTY.** Any building or portion thereof owned or exclusively leased by the Village. "Village property" does not, however, include any portion of a building that is rented or leased from the Village by a private person or entity.

**§ 38.02 FIDUCIARY DUTY.**

Village officials and employees shall at all times in the performance of their public duties owe a fiduciary duty to the Village.

**§ 38.03 IMPROPER INFLUENCE.**

(A) No Village official or employee shall make, participate in making or in any way attempt to use his or her position to influence any Village governmental decision or action in which he or she knows or has reason to know that he or she has any financial interest distinguishable from its effect on the public generally, or from which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months, or from which he or she reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months.

(B) No Village official, or any person acting at the direction of such Village official, shall contact, either orally or in writing, any other Village official or employee with respect to any matter involving any person with whom the elected official has any business relationship that creates a financial interest on the part of the official, or the domestic partner or spouse of the official, or from whom or which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months, or from whom or which he or she reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months. In addition, no elected official may participate in any discussion in any Village committee hearing or meeting, or in any Village Board meeting, or vote on any matter involving the person with whom the elected official has any business relationship that creates a financial interest on the part of the official, or the domestic partner or spouse of the official, or from whom or which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months, or from whom or which he reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months.

**§38.04 VILLAGE-OWNED PROPERTY.**

No Village official or employee shall engage in or permit the unauthorized use of Village-owned property.

**§38.05 USE OR DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.**

No current or former Village officials or employees shall use or disclose, other than in the performance of his or her official duties and responsibilities, or as may be required by law, confidential information gained in the course of or by reason of his or her position or employment. For purposes of this section, "confidential information" means any information that may not be obtained pursuant to the Illinois Freedom of Information Act, as amended.

**§38.06 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST; APPEARANCE OF IMPROPRIETY.**

(A) No Village official or employee shall make or participate in the making of any governmental decision with respect to any matter in which he or she has any financial interest

distinguishable from that of the general public, or from which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months or from which he or she reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months.

(B) (1) Any elected or appointed official who has any financial interest distinguishable from that of the general public or all trustees in any matter pending before the Village Board or any Board Committee, or from which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months, or from which he reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months shall publicly disclose the nature and extent of such interest on the records of proceedings of the Village Board, and shall also notify the Village Clerk of such interest within 96 hours of delivery by the Village Clerk to the member, of the introduction of any ordinance, resolution, order or other matter to be considered by the Village Board, or as soon thereafter as the member is or should be aware of such potential conflict of interest. The Village Clerk shall make such disclosures available for public inspection and copying immediately upon receipt. He or she shall abstain from voting on the matter but shall be counted present for purposes of a quorum. The obligation to report a potential conflict of interest under this subsection arises as soon as the member of the Village Board is or should be aware of such potential conflict.

(2) To avoid even an appearance of impropriety, any member of the Village Board who has any business relationship that creates a financial interest on the part of such member, or the domestic partner or spouse of such member with a person or entity with a matter pending before the Village Board or any Village Committee or Commission, or from whom or which he or she has derived any income or compensation during the preceding 12 months, or from whom or which he or she reasonably expects to derive any income or compensation in the following 12 months, shall publicly disclose the nature of such business relationship or income or compensation on the records of proceedings of the Village Board, and shall also notify the Village Clerk of such relationship within 96 hours of delivery by the Village Clerk to the member, of the introduction of any ordinance, resolution, order or other matter before the Village Board, or as soon thereafter as the member is or should be aware of such potential conflict of interest. The Village Clerk shall make such disclosures available for public inspection and copying immediately upon receipt. He or she shall abstain from voting on the matter but shall be counted present for purposes of a quorum. The obligation to report a potential conflict of interest under this subsection arises as soon as the member of the Village Board is or should be aware of such potential conflict. For purposes of this subsection (2) only, "matter pending before the Village Board or any Council Committee" shall refer to any action involving the award of loan funds, grant funds or bond proceeds, bond inducement ordinances, leases, land sales, zoning matters, or the creation of tax increment financing districts.

(3) No Village Officer or Official shall participate in any deliberations pertaining to any case, matter, controversy or litigation in which they have a present or future financial interest.

**§38.07 REPRESENTATION OF OTHER PERSONS.**

(A) No Village official or employee may represent, or derive any income or compensation from the representation of, any person other than the Village in any formal or

informal proceeding or transaction before any Village Commission or Board in which the Commission's or Board's action or non-action is of a non-ministerial nature; provided that nothing in this subsection shall preclude any employee from performing the duties of his or her employment, or any Village official from appearing without compensation before any Village Commission or Board on behalf of the residents of Crestwood in the course of his or her duties as a Village Official.

(B) No Village official or employee may derive any income, fee or compensation from the representation of any person in any judicial or quasi-judicial proceeding before any administrative agency or court in which the Village is a party and that person's interest is adverse to that of the Village.

**§38.08 POST-EMPLOYMENT RESTRICTIONS ON ASSISTANCE AND REPRESENTATION.**

(A) No former Village official or employee shall assist or represent any person other than the Village in any judicial or administrative proceeding involving the Village if the official or employee participated personally and substantially in the proceeding during his or her term of office or employment.

(B) No former Village official or employee shall, for a period of one year after the termination of the official's or employee's term of office or employment, assist or represent any person in any business transaction involving the Village if the official or employee participated personally and substantially in the subject matter of the transaction during his or her term of office or employment; provided, that if the official or employee exercised contract management authority with respect to a contract this prohibition shall be permanent as to that contract.

(C) Nothing in this section shall be construed to restrict a former Village official's or employee's activities on behalf of, and while employed by, another government agency.

**§38.09 INTEREST IN VILLAGE BUSINESS.**

(A) No Village official or employee shall have a financial interest in his or her own name or in the name of any other person in any contract, work or business of the Village, or in the sale of any article, whenever the expense, price or consideration of the contract, work, business or sale is paid with funds belonging to or administered by the Village, or is authorized by ordinance; provided, however, for purposes of this subsection, any of the following shall not constitute a financial interest in any contract, work or business of the Village:

(1) ownership of less than one percent (1%) of the outstanding common stock in any entity or its parent, subsidiary or affiliate, regardless of the value of dividends paid or accrued on such stock, and such stock is registered on a securities exchange pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended;

(2) compensation for property taken pursuant to the Village's eminent domain power; and

(3) any interest of a relative which interest is related to or derived from the relative's independent occupation, business or profession.

(B) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this section, no Village official or employee who has contract management authority over any contract, work or business of the Village shall have a financial interest in any entity which is a contractor, subcontractor, or otherwise a party to that contract, work or business. Unless sold pursuant to a process of competitive bidding following public notice, no Village official or employee shall have a financial interest in the purchase of any property that: (i) belongs to the Village, or (ii) is sold for taxes or assessments, or (iii) is sold by virtue of legal process at the suit of the Village.

#### **§38.10 CONTRACT INDUCEMENTS.**

(A) No payment, gratuity or offer of employment shall be made in connection with any Village contract, by or on behalf of a subcontractor to the prime contractor or higher-tier subcontractor or any person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order.

(B) No Village official or employee shall exercise contract management authority where any relative or the domestic partner of the official or employee is employed by or has contracts with persons doing Village work over which the Village official or employee has or exercises contract management authority.

(C) No Village official or employee shall use or permit the use of his or her position to assist any relative, or his or her domestic partner, in securing employment or contracts with persons over whom the employee or official exercises contract management authority. The employment of or contracting with a relative or domestic partner of such a Village official or employee by such a person within six months prior to, during the term of, or six months subsequent to the period of a Village contract shall be evidence that said employment or contract was obtained in violation of this chapter.

#### **§38.11. INVALID ACTIONS.**

All Village contracts shall include a provision requiring compliance with this chapter. Any contracts negotiated, entered into, or performed in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter shall be voidable as to the Village. Any permit, license, ruling, determination or other official action of a Village department or Commission applied for or in any other manner sought, obtained or undertaken in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter shall be invalid and without any force or effect whatsoever.

**SECTION 3:** Any policy, resolution or ordinance of the Village that conflicts with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION 4:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.

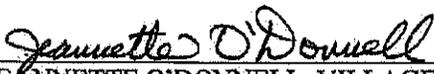
