


## VILLAGE NOTICE



Crestwood Village Ordinance prohibits parking on any village street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. The reason for this ordinance is so Police will be alerted to abandoned vehicles or suspicious vehicles that require investigation. This ordinance also ensures that all streets throughout the Village will be open to fire and rescue equipment in the event of an overnight emergency. This is especially necessary in areas where narrow streets can block large fire trucks.

In the past, police investigating parked vehicles have occasionally determined that they belong to residents and have not issued a citation unless a complaint was made by a resident. This practice of not issuing citations to residents will be stopped and all illegally parked vehicles will be ticketed in the future.

This change in policy is the result of requests by residents to eliminate inconsistency in the way citations may have been issued in the past. Most importantly, however, this policy change is to ensure that every citizen of the Village can sleep at home secure in knowing that in an emergency, help will arrive in a timely manner.

The initial fine for violation of the parking ordinance is \$75.00. There are signs posted on the Welcome to Crestwood signs located in several areas throughout the Village. This is a Village wide ordinance. Please be sure that your late night and overnight guests are made aware of this as well.

It appears that we have achieved 100% compliance. You may have noticed additional signs have been posted throughout the Village. We appreciate the cooperation of all the residents and businesses in the Village of Crestwood. We will continue to enforce this ordinance.

## 2014 VEHICLE STICKER APPLICATION UPDATE

Vehicle sticker applications for 2014 will be mailed to residents between November 18th and 26th. Please note stickers do not go on sale until December 2, 2013. Owners of multiple vehicles need to wait until they receive all applications before coming into village to purchase their stickers.

## Important Information for Businesses in Crestwood

Our Village Board has looked at the cost of Business Licenses and Liquor Licenses for businesses here in our Village. The Board would love to keep the license base fee at \$1.00 as it currently is, however they have determined at the attempt to cover rising cost they will be raising its current fees. These changes will be effective immediately for new businesses coming into the Village and will be enforced at renewal time in 2014 for existing businesses. The cost will be as follows:

- If your business is 2,500 total square feet or less, your business license fee will be \$100.00.
- If your business is between 2,501 and 7,499 total square feet, your business license fee will be \$200.00
- If your business is 7,500 total square feet or greater, your business license fee will be \$500.00
- All other fees for vending, non video amusement machines, juke box, ice, food service, dairy and cigarettes etc. will remain unchanged.
- In addition to our business licenses, there will be an increase to our liquor license as well, effective for the new licenses issued and renewals for the fiscal year May 1, 2013 to April 30, 2014.
- Package sales will be \$300.00. Beer & Wine consumption on premises will be \$400.00 Full Service bars will be \$500.00

## DISTRICT 130 TEACHER RECEIVES “A DAY MADE BETTER” SURPRISE FROM OFFICEMAX

## GEORGE WASHINGTON STUDENTS PLANT PINWHEELS FOR “WHIRLED PEACE”



A pinwheel is a childhood symbol. It reminds us of a time when things were simple, joyful and peaceful. At George Washington School in Alsip, students took time to celebrate the International Day of Peace by taking part in an art project and creating “Pinwheels for Peace.” Students planted their colorful pinwheels with messages of peace outside of the elementary school for the “Imagine...Whirled Peace” art installation. This is the second year students at George Washington School participated in the “Pinwheels for Peace” project.

International Day of Peace provides an opportunity for individuals, organizations and nations to create practical acts of peace on a shared date. In 2002, the United Nations General Assembly officially declared September 21 as that date but because it fell on a Saturday this year, George Washington students celebrated on Monday, September 23.

“I thought the Pinwheel Project for International Peace Day would not only help pay our respects to the 9/11 tragedy but also show students how we can unite and work together to make the world a better place,” said Kimberly St. Leger, art teacher for George Washington School and member of the Illinois Art Education Association. “Students really take away a form of gratitude from this project.”

Students created pinwheels of all shapes and sizes and approximately 300 pinwheels were on display in front of the school, as well as banners to show awareness of peace. The spinning of the pinwheels in the wind is supposed to spread thoughts and feelings about peace throughout the country and the world.

“Pinwheels for Peace” is an art installation project started in 2005 by two art teachers, Ann Ayers and Ellen McMillan of Coconut Creek, Florida, as a way for their students to express their feelings about what’s going on in the world and in their lives. The project was quickly embraced by their students and the entire school community and by millions of art teachers, teachers, parents, children and adults who desire peace in our world. This year over 4.5 million pinwheels were spinning in over 3,500 locations, including the United States, Europe, Asia, Australia, Canada, the Middle East, Africa and South America.



## BASS IN THE CLASS PROGRAM SWIMS INTO PAUL REVERE INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL CLASSROOMS

Fifth graders at Paul Revere Intermediate School in Blue Island have new additions to their classrooms this fall in the form of native fish. For a second year, students are participating in the Bass in the Class program sponsored by the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County. This hands-on aquatic biology program gives students firsthand experience with life cycles, food chains, ecosystems and animal behavior. On September 19, naturalists Leslie Bertram and Leah Pryor delivered fingerling smallmouth bass to two classrooms and discussed facts and tips about the bass and also performed chemical tests on the water as well as a water exchange in addition to taking questions from students. Students and teachers will care for their fish over a period of eight weeks. Students also

have the opportunity to post in the Bass Blog and learn about how students are caring for their fish in other schools. On November 7, students will celebrate and say goodbye to their bass at the forest preserve’s Big Bass Release event where the fish are released into a local waterway. In total, over 120 smallmouth bass were sent on their way to temporary homes in different schools around DuPage, Kane and Cook counties. Over 20 teachers and more than 530 students are participating this year.

## STUDENT WORKSHOPS BRING HISTORICAL FIGURES TO LIFE AT GEORGE WASHINGTON SCHOOL



Students at George Washington School in Alsip were quite the poised characters in their “Wax Museum” on the evening of Tuesday, October 22 at the school’s Family Reading Night. Prior to the annual event celebrating literacy, fourth and fifth grade students received a special visit from professional storyteller Judith Heineman in which she conducted interactive

workshops on how to bring the person they have studied, including inventors, scientists and civil rights leaders, to life in a wax museum setting. The theme for this year’s event was “History Comes Alive!” and students portrayed historical figures and learned warm-up exercises, gestures, eye contact, the use of props, and getting into character by imagining what time period they are in, the smells, clothing and setting during the workshop. Heineman is a storyteller, producer and teacher who has been selected as an Illinois Humanities Council “Road Scholar” and an Illinois Arts Tour and Residency Artist and has previously performed at George Washington School’s Family Reading Night.

## Bio-diesel science project fueled by SHEPARD HIGH STUDENTS

October 26, 2013 (CRESTWOOD, Ill.) -- This winter, some residents might get a whiff of pizza when the snow plows go by because those trucks will be running on fuel made from used cooking oil from a local restaurant.

Students from Alan B. Shepard High School in Palos Heights had a big idea for a science project. But they didn't have space in their school to contain it.

"We wanted to see what it was like to build bio-diesel," said senior Madeline Kachold. "We wanted to get our hands dirty."

So with the help of their physics teacher, the students cut a deal with the Village of Crestwood. City leaders allowed them to set up shop in their public works building. In return, the students supply them with free fuel. The students will even mount solar panels on the roof to make their own electricity for the system.

There's a lot of physics, piping and fluid mechanics, and electricity involved. We're wiring things up," said physics teacher Brian Sievers. "They're allowed to actually use knowledge that they've gained in a practical use to help somebody. What greater thing can we instill in kids?"

All of these trucks that run on diesel will burn cleaner and cheaper using the eco-friendly fuel converted from used cooking oil.

"We first dissected a hot water heater and took out most of the hot water heater components and are now using it as a bio-diesel refinery of sorts," said senior Mike Peretz. "So we're going to combine the used cooking oil from Beggar's along with methanol and potassium hydroxide and that will eventually drain into the dirty bio-diesel."

The mayor predicts it will save taxpayers roughly \$5,000 a year. "It will help our budget," said Mayor Lou Presta. "We can spend the money other places."

The bio-diesel system will remain in the village and students will maintain it on an on-going basis.







## Senior Check Program

Mayor Lou Presta has directed the Crestwood Police Department to develop a "Senior Check Program" as a means of providing the elderly citizens of our Village an enhanced sense of safety and service.

It directs personnel of the Village of Crestwood Police Department to have closer, one on one contact with those individuals who may need our assistance the most - the elderly. The program allows those residents over 60 years of age and who possess the desire to participate, direct access to the Police Department.

In addition to the accessibility, participants will find that the Police Department will be in closer contact with them on a periodic basis, thus increasing the level of security through enhanced communication.

Finally, The Senior Check Program will allow those elderly individuals in Crestwood, who may have a higher level of health risk, to be occasionally checked on by the Crestwood Police personnel.

Information from each participant will be recorded and maintained in a

confidential database for access by Crestwood Police personnel. Access to information such as family contacts and medical risks will help our personnel be better prepared to deal with emergency calls from participating individuals. This program will also help family members to feel more assured that their senior loved ones are safe and secure.

### TO QUALIFY FOR THE "SENIOR CHECK PROGRAM" AN INDIVIDUAL MUST:

- \*\* Be a resident of the Village of Crestwood.
- \* Be over the age of 60
- \* Be able to provide at least two emergency/ family contacts that are willing to be called by the Crestwood Police Department

Mayor Presta would also like to invite seniors to participate in the "Senior Assistance Program". This program was put in place to assist elderly and disabled residents with daily household tasks. Cutting the grass, raking, shoveling snow etc. can become difficult for many. We are currently looking for volunteers to assist us with this program. High school students looking to fulfill service hours would be ideal. This would be a chance for our youth to give back. A separate application must be filled out to be part of this program. This program is in the planning stages. Additional details will be forthcoming.

## MADIGAN URGES ILLINOIS RESIDENTS TO BE ON LOOKOUT FOR SCAMS IN AFFORDABLE CARE ACT ROLLOUT

Chicago — As more than one million individuals, families and small businesses in Illinois start to sign up for health insurance and financial assistance through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace, Attorney General Lisa Madigan today urged Illinois residents to educate themselves and use caution to avoid scam artists who may try to take advantage of this new program.

The Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace is a new online store where Illinois residents and small businesses can compare and enroll in medical and dental insurance. The insurance plans available through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace are approved by the federal government for Illinois residents as part of the Affordable Care Act. Additionally, individuals who enroll through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace will be able to determine whether they qualify for Medicaid coverage under the expanded Medicaid program or for tax credits to help offset their insurance premium payments.

Certified specialists trained by the Illinois Department of Insurance or the federal government will be available in Illinois to help individuals and small businesses enroll in an insurance plan through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace.

### Scammers Taking Advantage

Unfortunately, as with any new government program, con artists will take advantage of the change and potential confusion. In some cases,

these criminals will try to collect personal or financial information to steal your identity and your money. In other cases, unscrupulous salesperson will try to sell “discount medical plans.” Those so-called discount plans may be insurance plans that really do not save you money, or they may not be legitimate health insurance plans at all.

### Tips to Avoid Scams

- Do not pay for help. The government will not charge for its services. You never have to pay to receive help. If you receive an offer to sign up on the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace for a fee, you should hang up, delete or walk away. Do not give cash, your credit card or banking information to someone you do not know or did not contact.
- Make sure any specialist you work with is certified. If you are working with a specialist, make sure the specialist is certified. To confirm you are working with a certified specialist, consumers can visit the Illinois Department of Insurance website: <http://insurance.illinois.gov>. Starting October 1, names of certified specialists will be added to the searchable database on a rolling basis, so please check back periodically.
- Never open your door to a stranger, even if they claim to be a certified specialist. Instead, consult the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace to learn about the options you have and what you qualify for.
- Guard your personal information. Do not give out your Social Security number, bank account number, or other sensitive personal or financial information to someone who calls you, emails you or comes to your door. However, be aware that when you enroll for an insurance plan through the Health Insurance Marketplace, you will be asked to provide your Social Security number and payment information, among other personal information.

Before you do this, make sure you are on the official website and if you sign up in person, ask the specialist who is helping you to look away while you enter this information online.

- The Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace does not offer Medicare. Medicare is not affected by the Affordable Care Act, and you cannot enroll in Medicare through the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace. You should not share your Medicare number with anyone who contacts you uninvited. If you have Medicare questions, please call Medicare at **1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-877-9392)**.
- Use the Illinois Health Insurance Marketplace for one-stop safe insurance shopping. Consumers who enroll for insurance through the Health Insurance Marketplace can be sure they are accessing approved insurance plans and at the same time determine, based on their income, whether they are eligible for Medicaid coverage under the newly expanded program, or for tax credits to help offset their premium payments.

Illinois residents who have questions about how to enroll in insurance plans under the Affordable Care Act or have other general inquiries should visit [www.getcoveredillinois.gov](http://www.getcoveredillinois.gov) or call 1-866-311-1119. Consumers who wish to report a fraudulent solicitation should visit [www.illinoisattorneygeneral.gov](http://www.illinoisattorneygeneral.gov) to download a complaint form or call the Attorney General’s Consumer Fraud **Hotlines: 1-800-386-5438 (Chicago) | 1-800-243-0618 (Springfield) | 1-800-243-0607 (Carbondale)**

**Finally, to report identity theft, consumers should call their local police and then call the Attorney General’s Identity Theft Hotline at 1-866-999-5630 (TTY: 1-877-844-5461).**

## KIDS CAN'T BUY'EM HERE

### Sale of Tobacco To Minors Act

No minor under 18 years of age shall buy any tobacco product. No person shall sell, buy for, distribute samples of or furnish any tobacco product to any minor under 18 years of age. No sales clerk under 16 years of age may sell any tobacco product at retail. This does not apply to a sales clerk in a family-owned business which can prove that the sales clerk is a son or daughter of the owner. No minor under 18 years of age can use or facilitate the use of a false or forged identification to obtain any tobacco product. Non-tobacco products, except matches, together with tobacco products cannot be sold within a vending machine. The sale or distribution at no charge of cigarettes from a lunch wagon engaging in any sales activity within 1,000 feet of any elementary or secondary school grounds is prohibited.

### Prevention of Cigarette Sales to Minors Act

A carrier may transport cigarettes to any person only if the carrier reasonably believes such cigarettes have been received from a person described above. Nothing shall be construed to prohibit a person other than a carrier from transporting not more than 1,000 cigarettes at any one time to any person. A carrier may not complete the delivery of cigarettes to persons other than those described above without first obtaining from the purchaser an official identification that includes a reliable confirmation that the purchaser is at least 18 years of age; the cigarettes are not intended for consumption by a minor under 18 years of age; and a signed written statement that certifies the purchaser's address and age. The statement shall also confirm that the purchaser understands that signing another person's name, selling cigarettes to minors under 18 years of age and purchasing cigarettes by minors under 18 years of age is illegal.


