

VILLAGE NOTICE

Crestwood Village Ordinance prohibits parking on any village street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. The reason for this ordinance is so Police will be alerted to abandoned vehicles or suspicious vehicles that require investigation. This ordinance also ensures that all streets throughout the Village will be open to fire and rescue equipment in the event of an overnight emergency. This is especially necessary in areas where narrow streets can block large fire trucks.



In the past, police investigating parked vehicles have occasionally determined that they belong to residents and have not issued a citation unless a complaint was made by a resident. This practice of not issuing citations to residents will be stopped and all illegally parked vehicles will be ticketed in the future.

This change in policy is the result of requests by residents and to eliminate inconsistency in the way citations may have been issued in the past. Most importantly however, this policy change is to ensure that every citizen of the Village can sleep at home secure in knowing that in an emergency, help will arrive in a timely manner.

The initial fine for violation of the parking ordinance is \$75.00. There are signs posted on the Welcome to Crestwood signs located in several areas throughout the Village. This is a Village wide ordinance. Please be sure that your late night and overnight guests are made aware of this as well.



Crestwood Going GREEN!

READING TAKES FLIGHT DURING BALLOON LAUNCHES AT DISTRICT 130 SCHOOLS



As students, parents and staff watched in amazement as a sea of balloons were released above **Lincoln School** in Blue Island, jubilant students took pride in celebrating the completion of the 2013 Summer Reading Challenge. The second annual Balloon Launch Celebration held on September 5 celebrated the efforts of students who read and recorded the books they read over the summer. The Reading staff at Lincoln, including Dina Dombroski, Roberta Hardy, Christina Rank and Deanna King, kick started the Summer Reading Challenge and Balloon Launch during the school's "Summer Camp Read S'More" family literacy event in May. Students were also encouraged to visit the local library over the summer and in total, 110 students read 2,550 books and 255 balloons were released in two separate balloon launches. Students received one balloon for every 10 books read over the summer.

In addition to the Balloon Launch Celebration held at **Lincoln School**, fourth graders at **Whittier School** in Blue Island also took part in their own Balloon Launch Celebration the same afternoon as last year's third graders from Lincoln were also encouraged to participate in the Summer Reading Challenge. At Whittier, 12 students read approximately 350 books and 33 balloons were released.

MAYOR OF BLUE ISLAND VISITS SECOND GRADERS AT PAUL REVERE PRIMARY

Instead of a regular day on the job at City Hall on the afternoon of September 16, Mayor Domingo Vargas stopped by **Paul Revere Primary School** in Blue Island to pay a special visit to second grade students. Mayor Vargas, the first Latino mayor of the City of Blue Island, was invited to the primary school to talk about "Our Community" which is part of the second grade social studies curriculum. Along with his assistant Marisol Barrera, Mayor Vargas discussed his mayoral duties, the election process and his personal background.

Students were especially intrigued when the mayor passed around his badge and explained how part of his job is being in charge of the police and fire departments. While displaying his walkie talkie during the presentation, Mayor Vargas explained that another very important duty he has is to protect all residents, including our beloved pets and that when dangerous weather situations arise, he is in charge of turning on the sirens to alert the community. A lifelong resident of Blue Island, Mayor Vargas was elected to his post during the April 9 election.

In addition to being the mayor, he is a 52-year-old lawyer and the grandson of a Mexican immigrant who arrived in Blue Island in 1914. At the conclusion of the presentation, Mayor Vargas took questions from students in the audience and extended an invitation for them to visit City Hall.

The backstory: Busy with a teaching job and three kids, Lynn Kata rarely exercised and ate the meat-and-potatoes diet that she grew up on in Crestwood, Illinois. “I knew that I gained a few pounds here and there, but no one ever said anything,” Lynn says. “So I ignored it.” But over time, those pounds added up: By age 49, Lynn weighed 150 lbs. At 5 feet, 3 inches, this meant her body mass index rating categorized her as being overweight.

Her turning point: A snapshot from a going-away party forced Lynn to face reality. “I didn’t even recognize myself,” she says. With her 50th birthday less than a year away, Lynn decided that it was time to take control. She started by scaling back on soda and fast food, and going on a daily stroll. “I made it a goal to walk a little farther or a little faster each time,” she says. For an extra challenge, she added a 30-minute Lotte Berk fitness DVD to her routine.

What worked: Tracking her progress. “My son gave me a Nintendo Wii Fit video program, and I loved watching my avatar shrink, Lynn says. And she kept a food journal to keep tabs on her eating. “When I learned that 1 mile of walking only burned about 100 calories, the light bulb really went on,” she says. “I started asking myself if those nibbles were really worth it, because I didn’t want to undo all of my hard work!”

A new way of life: Instead of declaring certain foods off-limits, Lynn concentrated on adding more fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. “There’s no way that I am giving up pizza,” she says. “So I’ll have the veggie slice and pair it with a salad.” Lynn also started taking Zumba classes, and within four months she became an instructor. “I love to dance, so it doesn’t even feel like exercise,” she says. All of Lynn’s changes really paid off: By her 50th birthday, the scale flashed 110 pounds. “Now at 53,” she says, “I’m in the best shape of my life.”

Meet the Teacher Night: The most important night of the school year

With most students somewhere else – at jobs or doing homework – District 218 schools recently hosted what many educators would call the most important event of the year. Meet the Teacher Night (MTN), which allowed parents to follow an abbreviated version of their student’s class schedule, invited moms and dads to join as educational partners.



Among all the variables that affect student achievement, none exceeds parent involvement. MTN blended curriculum, academic expectations and answers to every question. “This event helps me set the tone for the year with the caring adults in my students’ lives,” said Julie Boone, a social studies teacher at Shepard High School.

Boone has developed a specific strategy for MTN. “I always attempt to convey two messages. That the school year will be challenging, but that students can succeed, and I am here to help. I also convey that the greatest compliment I can pay them is to hold students to high expectations. Understanding these messages is vital to student success,” she said. Like Boone, Richards High School teacher Kelly McKimson-Rhodes identifies parent communication among her most important duties. “Parental involvement at the high school level can be tricky when families are increasingly busy, so I like using our web resources to communicate with parents,” said McKimson-Rhodes, who has added a class Twitter account for more immediate access. Denise Horton, whose daughter Sydney is a Shepard junior enrolled in one of Boone’s classes, could have done anything with her evening. She chose to come to MTN.

“My daughter asked me to come. I would have anyway because I believe that parent involvement makes a huge difference. But she wanted me to meet her teachers. She likes them all,” Horton said. Teachers view parents as partners. Each possesses great influence on teenagers.

“As teachers, we are here to challenge our students and help them to grow. Supportive parents will advocate for a challenging curriculum and help students seek out resources or support when required. Further, caring adults who understand the expectations, routines, and average workloads of the class can gauge their student’s level of investment in the work,” Boone emphasized.

Teachers can pick out students – from the quality of their work and goal setting, class participation, and attitudes -- whose parents make education a priority.


“If they share their work and ideas over dinner, they always come back with greater clarity in their own thoughts. It is another layer of accountability for the student,” Boone said.

For many reasons, freshman year breaks students and parents from what they’ve known in education. High school challenges students with an unfamiliar academic environment. Parents start over as well when their children enter ninth grade. “Parents need to ask questions about assignments, homework, and class conversations.

Monitoring grades should also be a part of that investment,” Boone said.

Key moments occur when students encounter difficulty. When handled as a team, such challenges can become opportunities. “When a student makes a misstep, I’d hope that communication begins with the student. Freshmen in particular may need help realizing a mistake. They also might need help on how to have a conversation with a teacher about making up work or clarifying a concept. When students have that layer of support at home, they become much better self-advocates, and that is really the goal,” Boone said.

News from Nathan Hale Primary and Intermediate School



As part of our Positive Behavior Interventions and Support program (PBIS), the Nathan Hale Primary and Intermediate students have been introduced to the book, “Have you filled a bucket today?” The students have learned to “fill buckets” by saying and doing kind things for others. The students in the school have been challenged to “fill a bucket” every day. We are working on spreading our PBIS language of Be Respectful, Be Responsible and Be Safe to the community.

Pumpkin Carving Tips

Crestwood Fire Department: To Enter Ranks of Elite First Responders



CRESTWOOD, IL: The lives of residents, visitors and business employees in Crestwood will be far better off if and when emergency strikes, thanks to the Villages recent investment in three new state of art Advanced Life Support ambulances and the highly trained paramedics that will man them.

Each Advanced Life Support ambulance is equipped with the latest heart monitoring equipment, costing over \$30 thousand each. According to Chief Bruce, these monitors are so accurate doctors may rely on the results to direct arriving patients directly to specialized hospital treatment areas, bypassing Emergency Rooms and saving time when minutes matter and lives are at stake.

“These monitors can also detect carbon monoxide levels as well,” Bruce said. “Knowing right away what may be affecting people in an emergency response means we can direct victims to treatment faster, lessening the chance of death or permanent injury”. Bruce also reported that 45 fully trained paramedics are currently on staff and an additional 7 will be added by next month. “The equipment the Mayor and Trustees invested in elevates our department to the ranks of the elite fire departments in the state,” Bruce said.

Prior to this purchase, Crestwood could only transport people with minor injuries or illnesses to hospitals. The new equipment and fully certified paramedic means fire department personnel can transport even the most critically injured directly to local hospitals. “We no longer have to rely on an outside contractor to transport the injured,” Bruce said. “This means our own personnel can stay with the patient from the scene of an accident, illness or injury to the hospital. That consistency of care not only cuts minutes off of response time, it also provides better communication between the responding paramedics and the doctors and staff that will take over once we arrive at the hospital”.

Bruce said that a minimum of eight firefighters will be on duty each day in Crestwood, with at least five being fully qualified firefighter paramedics. In addition to the three new ambulances, a Paramedic Engine will also be available in the event of large scale or multiple emergencies.

Crestwood Mayor, Lou Presta, stated that these changes in the Village's fire department were in keeping with his recent campaign promise to help police and fire further professionalize their departments. “We also have two additional full time police officers starting this fall,” Presta said.
