**1. DISCUSSION ITEMS**

Village Engineer Ken Chastain of the Farnsworth Group gave a presentation of the infrastructure projects underway or being planned within the Village. These projects are called Vision 20/20 because most of them will be completed by 2020. The projects include:

4 major sidewalk projects; Cicero Ave. from the canal to 143rd St., Pulaski from the Cal-Sag to 143rd, Midlothian Turnpike from Central to Pulaski, and on 135th Street . Bicycle paths connecting to major bike paths in the area are being investigated.

Cedrick Robertson an MWRD Civil Engineer discussed:

The MWRD Tinley Creek flood bank stabilization control project which is underway. The MWRD flood control project at 135th & Central Ave. and the MWRD flood control project at LaVergne & Midlothian Turnpike which still need to be approved.

Ken Chastain then explained the projects concerning water:

The new roof on the water tank on Cal-Sag Road and the restoration of the tank. Water pressure within the Village and upsizing water mains on Cal Sag Road which will improve water pressure in several areas.

The Playfield Area Improvement Project: the Village is losing \$500,000/year due to loss of city water purchased from Alsip. Our pipes are 50+ years old and water lines need to be replaced. Sanitary sewers in the Playfield Area will be cleaned out, replaced where needed and relined to prevent leakage. The flow in these pipes needs to be monitored which is

required by the Federal Government.

The Cal Sag Development Plan, both West and East was presented.

A plan for Caesar Park was presented which involves park improvements, a possible rec. building and improvements in parking which would include green infrastructure and provide a small lake with a walking trail.

Geographic Information Systems is being considered for the Village.
